## Our mission & our work

### The mission of Water for Kids

Water for Kids aims to preserve and protect the good health of children and communities in the developing world by assisting in the provision of safe drinking water, good sanitation and other public health related measures.

### Our work in Uganda

We have been working in Uganda since 2005. We have provided funds to protect natural springs, repair broken pumps, sink boreholes and install rain water harvesting collection from roofs. We run annual field trips to Uganda, enabling interested people to work on projects. Recent projects include digging out and building a dam, which now provides clean water for 2,000 people and repairing a school water pump that had been broken for two years, enabling children to have safe water to drink while they are at school.

### Our work in Zambia


We have been working in Zambia to provide clean and safe water in both rural and semi-urban areas. In Fumbelo, one of our projects, we built a new water kiosk with six taps, giving the women and children more time for other activities. Before we installed the new kiosk, local people had to walk 2 kilometres and then queue to get the water they needed. The community has been involved in the project since its start, and its water committee will make sure that safe water will be available for many years to come. Local health professionals educate the community on good hygiene practices, including hand washing and clean toilets.



## *Safe Water ... Better Health*

**Water for Kids began in 1996 after two British environmental health practitioners visited Peru as part of a project to help eradicate cholera.**

After the trip, they created Water for Kids to help communities secure a clean water source. During our 14-year history, we have completed projects in Peru and Tanzania, and have funded projects in India, Gambia, Kenya and Sierra Leone. Water for Kids is now working in Uganda and Zambia and is funding projects in Tanzania and Rwanda. We aim to ensure that all of our projects are sustainable and run by the local community.
